A: City of Hamilton: Councillor Maureen Wilson

- Patios open! Thank you to Councillor Wilson and Council for covering patio application fee.
- March 29 Budget before Council. Highlights include a 5.9% tax increase. Comparison increases: Burlington 7.9% TO 7. Mississauga 5%. Guelph 5.3%. Not insignificant but necessary because of federal and provincial governments lack of support on housing. Housing was 100% prov paid now 70/30 city. Housing homelessness top priority should not be a hole filed by households, but has to be. ON is only province housing paid by property tax. Playing catch up being frugal to point of irresponsible so increase in capital. Public health increase paramedics. Ambulance another service downloaded to property taxes. Premier Mike harris made significant tax changes in 2000. Reducing single occupancy vehicle year 7 hamilton transit plan moving away from vehicle more sidewalk clearing, accelerating cyclying master plan 2009 had a refresh in 2019 was 25 years but accelerated to move up. This budget can't watch infrastructure crumble, invest in core, caring for people.

Ward 1 taxes run 3 to 1. Residential taxpayers carry most of burden.

More tax revenues with businesses to alleviate tax burden.

Vacant housing initiative add to revenue estimate? VUT vacant unit tax. Vancouver first to have it and then Toronto and Ottawa. Hamilton applied and got approval. All funds will go to affordable housing initiative. Because of financialization of housing market then have vacant homes. People wait for it to increase in value, trying to create incentive to have housing.

- Street closure Sterling Whitten to Forsyth APRIL AUGUST important work, large underground chamber. Chamber upgrade will improve water in Coote. Will have some
- Development updates:
 - 90 Carling St (backs on King property near Food Basics) Construction moving along.
 Rental and 7 stories. 100 units. Some affordable

- McMaster residence. Demolition complete. Residence expected to be completed for September 2025 – announced in PACCAR this week. Moving to fulfill all site plans that they agreed to
- o 804-816 King St W (@ Paradise) 6-storey. Approved by the City and ready to proceed.
- Westdale construction 2023:
 - Marion Ave S resurfacing next two weeks
 - Marion Ave N full reconstruction subsurface damage done from Churchill park works
 - o Resurfacing Cline Ave S King to Sterling, Whitton Rd, Oakwood Pl
 - o Sterling Sewer chamber work between Oakwood Pl and Forsyth
 - Sterling resurfacing King to Forsyth
- Churchill Hill Park Phase 2 construction park being used much more
- LRT some buildings torn down. Reminder request King 1 bus to remain through Westdale Village and request for another LRT stop needed between Longwood and Cootes.
- EV charging station electricity installed, EV must pay for parking spot when charging
- Anybody can park there. Can charge on other side.
- Support for streetscape from Councillor. Tracy to meet with Councillor.

B: Financial Update (Anita, Tracy):

- Bank Balance as of March 31, 2023 is \$78, 802.42
- A few more receivables and payables to happen in April.
- Received grant funds for 2022 expenditures \$28 000 + \$3289.63 bonus.
- Funds to come: \$4520 reimbursement from City for consultant action plan, contribution to operating fund and parking revenue amounts expected to be determined in May/June
- HST 2020 and 2021 ~\$10000 to come later in 2023
- Working to finalize things for audit and bring things up to date a few more documents needed, auditor will use what have now from accountant
- Anita and Tracy working to get accounting up to date new accountant with BIA expertise
- Agreement to move account to PACE Credit Union from last meeting update: Pace to changeover to Alterna so will wait until May/June to change account (their system is being changed over and updated first)
- Motion to receive financial update. Moved by Anita, seconded by Robert. Carried.

C: Westdale Theatre (Bob):

- Attendance numbers increasing, working on other programming
- Special programming (Hamilton Originals, film talks) continues
- Private rentals bringing in revenue, focus for theatre = more than just films
- Harry Potter series BIA is sponsor excellent attendance
- Star Wars series starting
- New series with Grass Hut as sponsor on April 20th
- Other films having very good attendance
- Increase in number of people coming to Westdale for the Theatre
- Sell outs on a number of things
- BIA working well with Theatre

D: Safety and Security (Anita, Tracy):

- Update on ATM issues seem to be resolved with all ATMs now being locked overnight
- Crime update: no reported in BIA area crime since last meeting. One residential burglary and motor vehicle theft well outside of BIA

- Window broken at Subway yesterday ~2am, doesn't appear to be anything taken
- Theatre alarm set off contact ~2am, contact not found so replaced, did not break in
- Attack on Sterling article in paper
- TBC test market video to be set up, funds to cover

E: Real Estate update (Tracy):

- Commercial: for lease at former Cuppa Tea, beside Dragon Court
- Residential: homes are selling in area, general lower sales for Hamilton, desirable place to live with walkablility
- Doors Open, Jane's Walk David and Tracy to chat. Free publicity
- Westdale TV van in 1960s on FB in California. Westdale TV longest running store in Westdale. Peter Goesinger. May 6 & 7 will be Jane's Walk and Doors Open.

- Statues quo, afternoons busy, slowly gearing up for summer programming, book sale planned for one of the BIA event weekends

- PATIOS OPEN! Need to purchase pylons and umbrellas. Motion to spend up to \$2000 for more pylons and umbrellas. Moved by Anita, seconded by Jordan. Carried.
- More renovations at UPS building a couple more food places expected to open soon, building painted, new signs coming, Basilique being renovated
- Building where fire was beside Dragon Court renos seem mostly complete.
- Retail artists shop to open sometime after renos at 948 King St new front windows & doors
- Former Pete and Kay location upstairs residential main floor expected to be a restaurant, but not yet listed for lease
- Cuppa Tea location listed for lease
- New businesses in basement of 1038 King St West One4All First Aid & CPR Services
- Business Awards of Excellence congratulations to winners Nannaa Eatery and Mikel Coffee.
 Very grateful winners.

H: Community Outreach (Tracy):

- McMaster PACCR meeting March 6th. Increased education move-out April 30th
- Hopefully nothing taken from Westdale Village

I: Streetscape (Tracy):

- A bit more electrical work to be completed when better weather (some outlets) supply issue with some of the outlets needed
- Snowflakes switched up last week of March
- Snowflakes in storage. Looking at less expensive local alternatives.
- Planters being moved to surround patios with pansies and curly willow in planters to cover until June. Some vine to take cool nights in planters and the reused once ferns ready for patio planters.
- Summer planters ready for early June confirmed funding for part from City they will pay our grower directly
- Earth Day community alleyway cleanup April 22nd, other BIA earlier in the week. Request to print and purchase picks. Ok to cover for coffee for volunteers?

Motion to spend up to \$300 for coffee, printing, pick up sticks for clean ups. Moved by Anita, seconded by Robert. Carried.
